

Apart from John Goodyer's historic and rather surprising record from Droxford "in a wood" in 1618, records are entirely within the New Forest area where it has a marked preference for sites with a history of disturbance after which short turf has re-established. This includes many of the World War 2 airfields, where it persists in modest numbers, and more recently a number of the "Verderer's Strips" around post-war conifer plantations where it seems to fare less well over time (see, for example, the records for Marchwood Inclosure).

N Hants: Rare Native

This fern is seriously declining in North Hampshire. At Micheldever Spoil Heaps it could not be refound when ARGM searched all the areas of short vegetation on 7 May 2012. It also seems lost from Farnborough Airfield. At Blackbushe it used to be spread over a large area in the northern part of the airfield with the total population estimated at c.2,000 in 1989. Most of this area is not within the active airfield and much of it has become scrubbed over with Gorse and Birch with the few surviving plants of Moonwort confined to patches of short vegetation. Apart from the records given below there are several very old records in the Tichborne to Hinton Admiral area inferred to be in tetrads SU53Q, SU52Z and the VC12 part of SU52Y.
